24/7 PRAYER WEEK 15th–21st August 2010

As a Church we are embarking upon a Week of Prayer in August. We will begin at all Services on Sunday 15th. Following the 6.30 Service the Upper Room will be open for all kinds of prayer, meditation and waiting on God, 24 hours, day and night, until the 9.00 am Service on Sunday 22nd August.

Why not:

- Volunteer to run particular activities e.g. quiet prayer, prayer through art, compline, children and family prayers, prayer to music, a praise session, praying the news, or anything you want to try ...
- Encourage a group of friends, or your house group, to sign up for an hour or two, or a whole night
- Join Morning Prayer or the Listening Prayer Group when they meet during this week
- Make this a priority and sign up to take part as much as you can at a time that suits or challenges you!
- Move your group or meeting that is already going on to make their activities part of this?
- Decide to fast and pray for a day or half a day

As we continue with prayer for our Vision we remind ourselves that last August we had early morning prayers every weekday. This is another great opportunity. We need to be much in prayer for the new Children's and Families Worker, the new Youth Worker and their respective ministries, activities starting up in September, our town and community and all aspects of the Trinity Project.
